Sherry Lynn Mabry, 75, of Owasso, Oklahoma, passed away peacefully in the early morning hours of Monday, August 4, 2025, surrounded by the love of her family.

Born December 19, 1949 in Oklahoma City, Sherry was the daughter of Charles and Doris (Titze) Sackett graduated from Tascosa High School in Amarillo, Texas, in 1967. It was during her high school years that she met the love of her life, James Howard Mabry, on a blind date that would change both their lives forever. 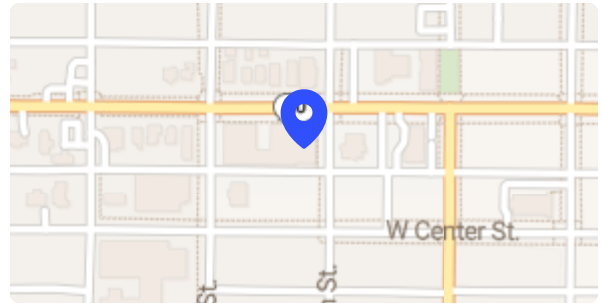

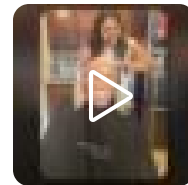

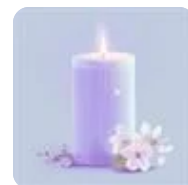
